Rise Up, Roots Down presents an opportunity for young people to step up in their local community and be backed by Landcare (3 X \$1000 + training) to run a successful Intrepid Landcare-inspired event by February 2018.

Young people = 16 years to 30-something years old

What's in it for you? The three successful ideas will receive \$1000 each to cover the cost of the events AND receive incredible training from Intrepid Landcare. The training will cover how to co-design, package and promote a killer event. Each group will receive first-hand experience with working with Megan Rowlett and Naomi Edwards, who have incredible experience in running fun, engaging and bloody awesome events. Training will be facilitated over Google-Hangout / Facebook, as they are located on the east coast of Australia.

What are we looking for in the submission?

- + The event, co-hosted by a local Landcare group, and must be run by young people for young people
- + The event seeks to inspire and connect young people to want to get involved in Landcare
- + The event must promote conservation, community, culture and adventure

What happens post-event? You completed a killer event by February 2018, it was epic! So what's next? Ideally, it would be great to continue working with your local Landcare group to inspire and connect other young people to act and lead with Landcare. This could involve kick-starting a local Intrepid Landcare group or similar. The idea is to keep the enthusiasm flowing and connect young people to endless opportunities.

What happens if I am not one of the top 3 ideas picked to receive funding? There are no losers in the Landcare movement. You will still have the opportunity to seek advice from Intrepid Landcare, and tap into networks and ideas, and perhaps kick-start a local Intrepid Landcare group. Opportunities are endless!

Terms of conditions

- + The project will be held in Western Australia
- + The project must connect young people with Landcare / other groups
- + The project is co-hosted by a Landcare / other group, preferably a member of the WA Landcare Network (or they can join up, it's free!)
- + The group can cover insurance and receive funding (the \$1000) for the event
- + The event must be held by the end of February 2018, or funding will be returned
- + The leader / working-group attends at least two touch-points with Intrepid Landcare / WA Landcare Network
- + You are serious about making a difference for the environment and/or community
- + You are up for adventure
